It is important for the Town to receive this information sooner to make planning adjustments and will ask for information faster if possible, the Town has received a package of information late last week and that is being reviewed and will be provided to Council soon.

CAO Spear – Updated Council with the October 2020 Staff Report.

Councillor Groulx – Noted that water bills will be issued in the next couple of weeks. Billing will be due around Christmas. The spring billing was given an extended 6 months to pay for the water bill due to COVID-19. Both bills will be due for payment near Christmas.

Councillor Gumushel – The Mayor and CAO met with other municipalities under the Municipal Service Agreement with the RCMP. When did this occur?

CAO Spear – The meeting of the Mayor and CAO's took place approximately two weeks ago. Discussions surrounded mutual concerns and developing a united voice in discussions.

Naish – This was a meeting of only Mayors and CAO's. We will keep Council posted on the process and next steps forward. Currently a letter being drafted by the Town of Oromocto and will be circulated for approvals.

Deputy Mayor Henderson – Cracking issues with the newly resurfaced tennis courts. Is there a concern?

CAO Spear – We believe the job was done correctly. Half of the cracking that has appeared is developing in areas that were not addressed in the original repair. To date the cracks do not affect play and repairs have taken place this fall to correct the cracking. This will become a yearly maintenance process due to the climate, ice and winter buildup.

Councillor Groulx – Noted that property assessments are coming out and they are directly affected by the rise in home prices in Saint Andrews. Councillor Groulx urged everyone to review their assessments and let Town Hall know of any increases so we can react accordingly.

Mayor Naish – Councillor Groulx has a point and there is a 30-day timeframe to review assessments now. We can let the property owner know their rights and who to speak with.

Deputy Mayor Henderson – Can we clarify 2.1.4 are we still allowing motorized snow vehicles and not ATV's? Section 3.1 please add or "Town Trails" as some trials in town, i.e. the golf course, use utility vehicles. We do not want to limit private use on private property.

Mayor Naish – Agree that if ATV's are not allowed snowmobiles are in the same boat.

Councillor Harrison – Sections 2.1.6 and 2.1.7 need to go a step further, are we restricting motorcycles on town roads?

Deputy Mayor Henderson – Could be interpreted as motorcycles are prohibited.

Councillor Groulx – We can say motorcycles are exempt.

Deputy Mayor Henderson – Note that there are hybrid motorcycles and dirt bikes. Our intent is not to ban street legal uses just trying to stop ATV drivers on trails and roads.

COUNCILLORS' AND DEPUTY MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Deputy Mayor Henderson – The Mayor and I attended the UMNB Annual General Meeting on Sunday October 4th via electronic means. Our motion for a three-year term of Council was rejected. Many municipalities felt that a three-year term was not long enough to carry a mandate. I respect the decision these municipalities made for their communities. It did bring up a greater discussion on acclamations. Half of the Mayors were acclaimed in the last municipal election including 160 Councillors and 6 positions that were not filled. The harshness of social media and COVID-19, UMNB needs to look at how to get people to step up and participate. We have also seen a massive decline in voting. This needs to change.

Deputy Mayor Henderson – Tonight I am honoured to be wearing a hat that was gifted to me from an Elder of the Passamaquoddy. I learned a great deal with my discussion with the Elder and the Orange Shirt Day. Orange Shirt Day reminds us of the children that attended Residential Schools and the indignity they were subject to.

Councillor Groulx – This falls onto what Deputy Mayor Henderson touched on in that there are still a lot of people who did not know about Orange Shirt Day including myself. It highlighted to me that we need to do a better job of promoting such events and that Council takes these to heart. We need to be better attuned to these issues and respond accordingly in the future.

Councillor Akagi – Orange Shirt Day is every September 30th for remembering those who were in Residential Schools. I know the Bank of Nova Scotia had orange shirts on, the schools in town took part, and it continues to grow and gain momentum. Deputy Mayor Henderson met with an Elder from Pabineau First Nations and she is a wealth of information. October 4th was Sisters in Spirit for murdered and missing Indigenous people all over Canada. This initiative was started by relatives and family members that had missing or murdered friends and family. Many of these people that are missing have never been found and is a very sad occasion. October 4th is a wonderful celebration and thank you to everyone who participated, it was greatly appreciated.

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Mayor Naish – Speaking to Deputy Mayor Henderson's topic of the UMNB meeting, the Zoom call started at 8:30 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. It was an extensive meeting and our motion was well received. We had the opportunity to meet our new Minister of Local Government and Local Government Reform, and with a name title like this, it is important to note that this will be a focus of local government versus the old department of Environment and Local Government.
