3. 48 Augustus Street Development Opinion of Council, PED210606

Staff presented the situation to Council at 48 Augustus Street and the request for variances for reduced frontage and reduced parking measures. Council discussed the process of subdividing the lands and the rezoning process to which when a parent property is subdivided, it carries the zoning with it. Council questioned the requirements for landscaping strips, decorative fencing, and a blocking wall around the property. Council had concerns regarding the balcony lengths and distances to adjacent property lines. Council had some concerns regarding the height of the building, being 3 storeys and not necessarily fitting the landscape of the adjacent properties. Council felt this plan might be better suited on another property in the community and for the developer to circle back to the

Town for further discussions. The Planners noted that a two-storey 4 unit apartment would not need the variances and could go for building permits but this model may not be economical for the developer. Council discussed modifications to the motion to provide feedback to Planning Review and Adjustments Committee on 48 Augustus Street.

The property shall be screened from the view adjoining properties through a 2m (6.6ft) wide planting strip of landscaped open space or by a wall or decorative wooden fence or chain link fence with filler strips woven into the mesh or some other screening facility of equal screening value; such screening facility to be at least 1.5 m (4.9 ft) and so located as not to conflict with any site triangle requirements.
- 2. That all other Town By-Laws, Provincial and Federal Acts and Regulations are followed including but not limited to By-Law 18-01, A By-Law to Regulate Vehicular Traffic in the Town of Saint Andrews.
- 3. That, with the exemption of incorporating aforementioned Condition 1, the project is developed in substantial conformity with the attached site plan.

3. Cooke's Aquaculture Proposed Fish Hatchery and Test Wells, PED210503

Council discussed the test wells for the proposed Fish Hatchery from Cooke's Aquaculture. All questions and comments will be provided to the Department of Environment and Local Governance for further feedback. The discussion highlighted reduced precipitation and how the draw would affect the replenishment of the watershed, discrepancies from the proposed original permit to draw 1500m3 versus what was presented to Council at approximately 600m3, how the Environmental Impact Assessment will provide further details to select questions from Council, and those additional communications would need to occur once the tests of the test wells are

completed. Council requested that no further work be taken after the test well tests to allow for feedback and consultation.
