		WHEREAS Municipalities were not consulted at any stage of the negotiation process, despite the outcome of these negotiations having a direct and significant impact on municipal operators; and

WHEREAS Municipalities are eager to work more closely with other orders of government and the RCMP on contract policing issues to ensure the financial sustainability of contract policing and to maintain the service levels necessary for community safety; therefore

WHEREAS RCMP cost increases will disproportionately impact rural

BE IT RESOLVED That the Town of Saint Andrews joins the Federation of Canadian Municipalities is calling on the federal

G. REVIEW OF REGISTERS AND COMMUNICATIONS TO BE DISCUSSED AT THE REGULAR OR SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL

1. Winter Parking Ban Letter Kalen Mawer

Council discussed the letter submitted by Kalen Mawer on the winter parking ban and downtown residential parking options. Council debated on the topic of a public parking area, issues with enforcement, the difficulties of residents without parking options, and options to leave the parking situation to landlords and private businesses to offer parking options in the community. After discussion, Council provided direction that parking for residents in the downtown is the responsibility of the landlords or private businesses that want to offer parking to residents for a fee for the winter.

2. Charlotte County Dial-A Ride Parking Space Request

Council was in favour of offering a parking space at the W.C. O'Neill for the Charlotte County Dial-A-Ride van. A motion will be brought forward at Council for this.

3. Ice Rental Cost Ryan Martin Senators Hockey Team

Council discussed the letter submitted by Ryan Martin regarding a reduction in ice rates. Council directed staff to keep the rate as-is and send educational material to the user groups on how the arena processes have returned to semi-normal with masks and proof of vaccination.

I. QUESTION PERIOD

It is about the parking needed for a new building would be one per apartment instead of 1.25. Does that include visitors' parking? In winter, if you have visitors, where are they parking at night if there is only 1 parking per apartment? Are there provisions for that in the changes in urban planning? If they have time, it would be something to discuss.

Council noted that this information should be considered when reviewing the next phase of the Zoning By-Law for consideration.
